ATD's founder, Joseph Wresinski (1917-1988), grew up in extreme poverty, which fed his conviction that the only way to advance social justice is to recognize and build on the strength, intelligence, and courage of people in poverty. Wresinski considered people in poverty to be leaders with an important vision of a world where all people are accepted and respected. The projects he developed were not simply designed alongside people in poverty; they were consistently inspired by their unique experience and understanding.

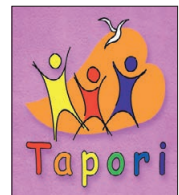

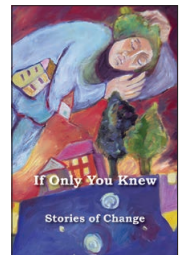


If Only You Knew - Stories of Change

These stories show that poverty can be overcome and present a positive message in contrast to the continuous stream of negative news that has left many people feeling discouraged and powerless.

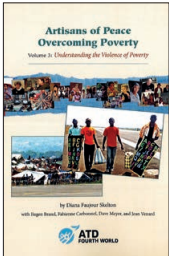

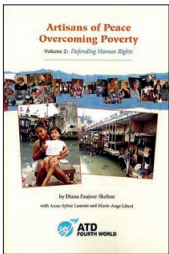


Artisans of Peace Overcoming Poverty Volume 3: Understanding the Violence of Poverty

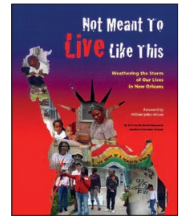
Not Meant to Live Like This Weathering the Storm of Our Lives in New Orleans

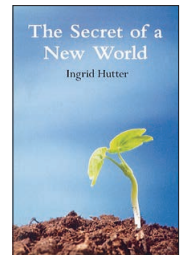


The Secret of a New World

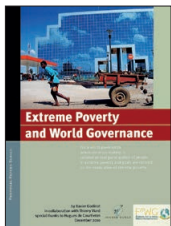

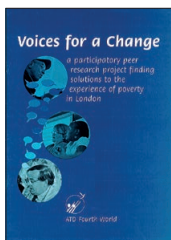

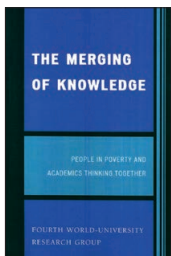


Voices for a Change

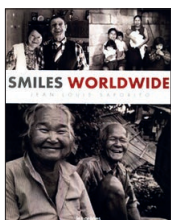

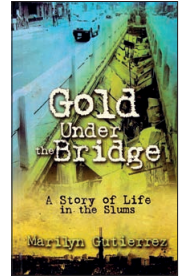

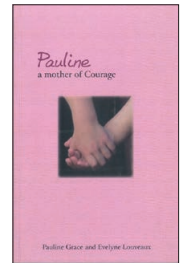


Pauline, a Mother of Courage

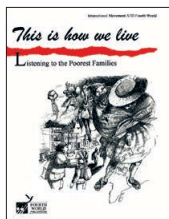


Finding Work: Tell Us the Secret

This Is How We Live

Listening to the Poorest Families

Fourth World Publications, 1995, 170 pages

In the first part of this study, very deprived families from the United States, Guatemala, Thailand, Burkina Faso and Germany tell their stories; stretching back over several generations. In the second part, the Fourth World Volunteers analyze lessons we learned from these stories. The families presented here differ from one another in their ethnic, geographic and religious origins. Their voices break new ground in poverty policy. To be successful, programs need to be initiated, implemented and evaluated with the people in poverty themselves. The underprivileged must be considered the principal partners in their liberation.
